
4. OTHER MATTERS

- Fred Brown, Govan Emerson, Henry Lee Spearman, Albert McWilliams, and Charlie Frank Reeves - first Black bus operators at MARTA.
- Gail Blackmon a retired receptionist and secretary who was one of MARTA's first Black employees.
- **Morris J. Dillard Sr.** Director of Community Relations and one of MARTA's first Black executives.
- **Coy Dumas Jr.** MARTA's longest-serving bus operator and retired in 2023 after 50+ years of service.
- Charlie Frank Reeves first Black Bus Operator Supervisor at Atlanta Transit in 1963. Atlanta Transit was acquired by MARTA in 1971.



PROCLAMATION MARTA Black History Day February 22, 2024

Whereas:	MARTA's Board of Directors acknowledges the invaluable contributions, dedication, and legacy of the Black employees who have played a pivotal role in shaping the foundation of the Authority and have exemplified exceptional leadership, resilience, and innovation while breaking down barriers and paving the way for future generations; and
Whereas:	Fred Brown, Govan Emerson, Albert McWilliams, and Henry Lee Spearman where among the first Black bus operators in 1962 for Atlanta Transit System Bus Company which would later become MARTA in 1972; and
Whereas:	Charlie Frank Reeves , one of the first Black bus operators and the first Black bus supervisor, was among the first employees hired at Atlanta Transit System Bus Company which would later become MARTA in 1972; and
Whereas:	Morris J. Dillard, Sr. , one of the original 13 employees of MARTA, whose tireless advocacy led to the passing of the 1971 referendum that created MARTA, in his 20 years with the Authority served as Deputy General Manager and as Director of Community Relations – one of MARTA's first Black executives; and
Whereas:	Gail Winfrey Blackmon was one of the original 13 employees of MARTA who helped advocate for the 1971 referendum, and having spent 23 years with the Authority, retired in 1995; and
Whereas:	Coy Dumas, Jr. is among MARTA's earliest Black bus drivers and is honored as the Authority's longest serving bus operator who has driven over two million miles accident-free in his 51 years of service from 1972 to 2023; and
Whereas:	Ike Bethel, Jr., James C. Emerson, Bobby J. Kenner, Hubert Minor, Marion H. Parks, Willie Phillips, Jr., William S. Tanks , Marcus Thomas , and Walter Wilkins , who are collectively known as the Avondale Nine, are recognized for their dedication and expertise in bus and railcar safety and maintenance as they were MARTA's first Black railcar technicians and part of the group of employees responsible for the deployment of MARTA's first heavy railcar service in 1979;

Now, therefore, be it resolved that MARTA's Board of Directors deems it appropriate and proper that February 22, 2024, be proclaimed MARTA Black History Day, and encourages all staff to reflect on the accomplishments and contributions of these outstanding individuals, and hereby declares our deepest gratitude and appreciation to our historical Black employees, whose legacy will forever be etched in the annals of our organization's history.
