Regional Infrastructure Accelerator ("RIA")

Demonstration Program

- USDOT/Build America Bureau issued Notice of Funding Opportunity ("NOFO") on April 27, 2023
- RIA grants serve to assist entities (such as public transit agencies) in developing innovative financing strategies for the accelerated delivery of transit and transit-oriented development ("TOD") projects.
- Strong emphasis on development of a project for funding under the Transportation Infrastructure
 Finance and Innovation Act ("TIFIA") Credit Program, however, encouraged to pursue other
 innovative strategies.
- MARTA submitted its grant application with letters of support from GDOT, Senators Ossoff and Warnock, Congresswoman Lucy McBath and Congressman Hank Johnson.



MARTA was Awarded \$1.75 million for its RIA in October 2023

Metro Atlanta Transit Infrastructure and TOD Accelerator

- MARTA was awarded the full amount requested
- Grant period is two years (Cooperative Grant Agreement on track to be executed in March 2024)
- Use of funds identified in MARTA's Application:
 - (1) \$175,000 for MARTA staff time
 - (2) \$1,525,000 for third party consultant services:

Underwrite transit and TOD projects and develop financing strategies for the accelerated development of a project(s) that is eligible for funding under TIFIA, as well as other innovative funding sources and methods to leverage public funds to secure private investment.

- This work will supplement the on-going efforts of MARTA to raise capital for its projects
- No local funding match is required

Project Background

The existing 480V and 750V power equipment (Auxiliary and Stinger Power) at all three of the rail car maintenance shops are in a state of disrepair. Replacement of this equipment is required to support ongoing and future maintenance activities at the Armour, Avondale and South yard rail maintenance facilities.


Project Objectives

Operational and Cost Benefits

- Reduces costs for call outs to perform urgent repairs
- Eliminates equipment obsolesce and improves system safety
- Eliminates impacts to ongoing railcar repairs and availability to support revenue
- Upgrades certain power supply equipment to make them suitable for the new CQ400 rail cars
- Reduces potential impacts on commissioning of the new CQ400 rail cars

Safety and Functional Benefits

- Prevent unintentional and unauthorized energizing of train circuits
- Eliminate arc flash when plugging and unplugging
- Automatic shutdown if there is no current draw from the equipment
- Custom plugs equipped with interlock safety circuits
- Upgrade to finger-safe conductor bar










